Background Information: Human trafficking is a form of modern-day slavery, and involves the use of force, fraud, or coercion to exploit human beings for some type of labour or commercial sex purpose. Globally, according to the International Labour Organization, it is estimated that there are some 20.7 million men, women, and children who are detected as victims of human trafficking.

Today's Praise Appeal Service follows the initiative of the Lutheran World Federation that the three years leading up to the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation in 2017, focus on Creation—Not for Sale; Human Beings—Not for Sale: Salvation—Not for Sale.

GATHERING

Voice 1: Around the world in every land, the cries of those in bondage are muted by greed, indifference and ignorance.

Voice 2: We do not want to know, we do not want to hear, we turn away from painful truth of slavery in our modern world.

All: Open our hearts to the suffering of others.

Voice 3: Give us strength to be advocates of the forgotten; to stand up for those whose lives have been stolen by human trafficking.

All: Open our hearts to the suffering of others.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS:

Leader: Blessed be the holy Trinity, +one God: the source of all that is; who looks into the darkest portion of our being with compassion and mercy. **Amen**.

Leader: Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another. *All: All knowing God, have mercy on us.*

We confess that we are held by our selfish desires, while we ignore the cries of those who suffer. We have turned from your will and have not loved you or our neighbours as ourselves. Forgive us, embrace us, and move us to new awareness of the needs of our brothers and sisters, here and around the world. Flood our hearts with your merciful love, and turn us from our sins that we may serve you and your children with transformed attitudes and loving hearts. Amen
