It explores different aspects of the ecumenical movement at international, national and local levels. It explores what it means to be a

**66 million Lutherans DO make a difference!** The Lutheran World Federation is celebrating its 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year. Active with 140 member churches in 78 countries and representing 66 million Lutherans, we do make a difference! The LWF began as a response to the critical need of Lutheran refugees in Europe following World War II. Today that same commitment is lived out in many places around the world. **Wade in the Water and take action on World Water Day (March 22, 2007):** Last year's World Water Day events, co-sponsored by KAIROS, Council of Canadians, and CUPE, were so successful that KAIROS has decided to do it all over again! This year's focus will be on two main advocacy points: regulating Canadian corporate activity that damages water supply through overuse, diversion, and pollution; and getting to Canada to acknowledge that access to clean water and sanitation is a human right. - If you haven't already done so, get your municipality to sign on the [Water Declaration](#).
- Visit your MP to talk about water issues – specifically the impact of Canadian corporate activity on water, and water as a human right. What if there's an election? Sponsor an all-candidates debate on water issues!
- Book Club on [Water, Inc. by Varda Burstyn](#): a fictional tale of bulk water exports by a Canadian author. This is an easy event to hold in your home, church, or community center – the book is widely available in paperback, and we'll provide discussion questions.
- Film viewings and discussions – stay tuned for more information!

## 12. OUR STORIES

### Web Savvy Congregations

A recent e-newsletter from Augsburg Fortress regarding a survey of internet usage in the United States prompted me to do a little searching on my own about internet usage in Canada. According to Statistics Canada, two-thirds of adult Canadians surfed the Internet in 2005. In that same year, over 15 million individuals (adults) accessed the internet from home for personal, non-business reasons, which is about 90% of all internet users. Of that number, almost two-thirds used it every day during a typical month, and just under one-quarter reported using it 10 hours or more during a typical week.

There is no question that the internet is a part of our daily lives; whether it be for work or for our hobbies and interests, the internet provides quick, efficient and sometimes overwhelming access to information. For our younger Canadians, statistics on internet usage are even more staggering; many of today's youth don't know what it was like to have to search through hard copies of reference books and encyclopedias to do their homework assignments.

What does the prevalence of the internet in our day-to-day activities mean to congregations?

Having a web presence, even if just for letting others know you're there and to provide basic information, is a vital communication tool. For some, going to the internet may be the first contact a new member might have with your congregation.

Does your congregation have a website? What does it say about your church?
