BOOK CLUB QUESTIONS

The book of Daniel offers us a glimpse into life under tight restrictions at least.

- In what ways does life under the current COVID-19 pandemic resemble (or differ from) what we read about in the book of Daniel?
- Who were the restrictions for and why?
- Who were exempt from those restrictions and why?
- How is power used to enforce the restrictions?

In the midst of perils and tribulations, God is present with the marginalized, the poor, the vulnerable, and the weak.

- What evidence of that do we have in the book of Daniel?
- How is God's hand leading us through and out of the pandemic? How can that relate to God's journey with us in these pandemic times?

Daniel, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego remind us of refugees, immigrants, and minority groups. They are expected to forsake who they are and become who they are not.

- In what ways does the integration of various cultural and racial groups within the church over the years reveal a pattern of assimilation and rejection of who they are?
- Why is it that we feel threatened by that which is different?

- How can you reach out to people from vulnerable, minority and marginalized communities in the church?

- What lessons can the church draw from the book of Daniel?
- How does the book inspire us to be 21st century people of faith who persevere and bring hope in an increasingly challenging environment?
