Dear Minister Champagne:

On behalf of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada (ELCIC), I am writing to express our support for the recent vote by Canada at the United Nations that recognized the right of Palestinian people to self-determination and equality.

The ELCIC supports Canada's *goal of a comprehensive, just and lasting peace in the Middle East, including the creation of a Palestinian state living side by side in peace and security with Israel.*<sup>1</sup> We seek a peace with justice for both Israelis and Palestinians and see your willingness to show support for the end of the occupation and the rights of Palestinians to self-determination as a crucial step forward.

The ELCIC has a long standing relationship with our partner church in the region, The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL). Through this relationship, I have had many opportunities to visit and witness first-hand the impact of the occupation on the lives of Palestinians of different faiths. My most recent visit was last month; as such, safety and peace for all people in the Holy Land are very much on my heart and mind. Our hope is rooted in our belief that *God desires that all people live in peace and without division and that there is a deep longing among Palestinians, Israelis, and the people of the world for safety, freedom, justice, security, dignity, and respect.*<sup>2</sup>
