Pastora Wilma Rommel, Presidenta, Iglesia Evangélica Lutherana Unida (IELU) recently shared how accompaniment has played a significant role in encouraging their church in several areas, including caring for the environment.

“The accompaniment of the ELCIC through the IELU program in Patagonia... has challenged us to get involved in ‘no a la mina’ (no to mining),” says Pastora Wilma. Mining in this region is linked to the exploitation of minerals and is detrimental to the health of people, fauna and flora.

Last year, the ELCIC held a Scholarship Appeal, helping students at schools of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL) who were facing challenging circumstances during the COVID-19 pandemic.

ELCJHL Bishop Sani Ibrahim Azar shared his gratitude for the partnership between our two churches and support of the ELCIC. “We thank God for prayers and financial gifts offered by ELCIC congregations and members,” he says.
