

Background

We seek to walk in a good way with our Indigenous neighbours. One thing we can do as faith communities is learn about Indigenous spiritual practices and honour them. Canada's Truth and Reconciliation Commission Call to Action # 60 asks us to do this work, individually and together. In the fall of 2023, the Kanata Centre at Martin Luther University College had the privilege of hosting an art exhibit called *A Visual Reconciliation*. The project was conceived by Indigenous artist Dazaunggee (Paul Shilling, Rama First Nation), who wanted to reflect visually on the Seven Sacred Teachings of the Anishinaabe. He invited three non-Indigenous artists, Julie Tián, Xavier Fernandes and Ted Fullerton, to respond to the teachings from their own contexts, leading to this collection of artwork. (https://avisualreconciliation.blogspot.com/). This collection and the reflections, resources and responses to it were the seed idea for creating this resource for congregational use.

The Circle for Reconciliation and Justice (CRJ) invites you to set aside seven weeks to engage with the wisdom of **The Seven Sacred Teachings.** CRJ encourages churches in the Eastern Synod and across Canada to reflect as a wider community and to continue to learn about Indigenous culture and spirituality as part of our reconcili-ACTION, in response to TRC Call to Action #60.

Home Engagement Resource

Developed to accompany Rama artist Dazaunggee's (Paul Shilling) exhibit, *A Visual Reconciliation: Cross-cultural Artistic Reflections on the Seven Sacred Teachings*, this resource offers daily and weekly reflections and activities for adults, youth, and children to reimagine Christian practice and teaching in response to the Seven Sacred Teachings and Christianity's role in colonialism.

This resource does not follow the lectionary for May 19 – June 30th, 2024; however, it offers theological context for engaging with the Seven Sacred Teachings, as well as scripture passages, prayers, contemplative practices, song suggestions, and hands on activities that can be adapted for use in worship, with children/youth programing, bible study, or as the originally intended home reflections.

Introduction to the Seven Sacred Teachings

"The teachings in Ojibwe (Anishinaabe) cultures have been traditionally passed down from generation to generation orally through stories and ceremonies. Historically, this was done by the elders who carry the stories and traditions. Today the oral traditions are being shared by those who carry the knowledge of such things. The teachings of all Indigenous cultures encompass the morals, values, structures, ceremonial practices, and spiritual beliefs of the group. These teachings also ensured the survival of the people. The teachings vary from nation to nation, because of the geographical placement of each particular group. However, the sacred teachings commonly come from the same root and share a similar message."

Of all the North American Indigenous teachings, the Seven Sacred Teachings, also known as Seven Grandfather or Seven Grandmother Teachings, are the most commonly shared from coast to coast. Many Indigenous organizations and communities have adopted the seven guiding principles, in one form or another, as a moral stepping stone and cultural foundation. Each community has adapted the teachings to suit their community values. Despite where the teachings may have originated, they share the same concepts of abiding by a moral respect for all living things.

Suggestions for congregational engagement

Weekly post Worship activities

- Create a space where the Seven Sacred Teachings can be displayed with words or images and invite people to add their reflections (post it notes etc.) on:
 - What they heard that day
 - Record an anecdote or small story about that week's Guide (i.e. 'it took courage for me to..')
 - o or where did they encounter that Guide in the past week
 - How are these teachings seen/ reflected in interactions they have had with other people, perhaps form other cultures
 - Which of the sacred teachings resonated most personally?
 - Once all seven of the sacred teachings have been exlpored, what was learned about exploring spiritual practices not thier own?
 - How has the exploration of the sacred teachings impacted them?
- Follow in Martin Luther's footsteps and provide an opportunity for Table Talks by starting the conversation off with a question pertaining to the Seven Sacred Teachings.
 - o This could happen during coffee time after the church service
 - Over lunch or dinner during the week
 - At dinner church
 - o or wherever anyone may sit and share food or drink with fellow congregants during the week
- For German speakers
 - Listen to the Martin Luther Radio Devotion Sundays at 9.30 a.m. (eastern time) on CHLO Radio station AM 530
 - o or anytime afterwards found on the homepage https://martinluther.ca/de/
 - Disclaimer: The teachings might follow a different order

Seven Sacred Teachings Art Activity for all Ages!

Overview

This is a two-part activity. For Option A you will need to print the posters found in the attached resource (Seven Sacred Teachings Posters.pdf). Option B uses the artworks from "A Visual Reconciliation: Cross-cultural Artistic Reflections on the Seven Sacred Teachings," (https://avisualreconciliation.blogspot.com/). These activities could be used weekly for reflections, or at the end as a way to 'wrap up' / bring people together to engage with all the Sacred Teachings. They do not need to happen together or sequentially.

Option A

Suggested Time: 45 minutes

Set up: The facilitator will post the Seven Sacred Teachings on the wall, side by side; at eye level. (Images are found in **Seven Sacred Teachings Posters.pdf**).

- 1. Choose a teaching that resonates most with you in this moment: **Bravery, Honesty, Humility, Love, Respect, Truth, Wisdom**
- 2. Then quietly read all the words of the teaching chosen. Choose 2-3 words or phrases that sparkle for you...that jump out and call your attention.
- 3. Head to a table preset with a 4"x6" or 5"x7" sheet of watercolour paper, a thick and a thin brush, a watercolour set, a jar of water per person.
- 4. Use masking tape to mark off $\frac{1}{4}$ " $\frac{1}{2}$ " around the edges, and affix the paper to the table.
- 5. Do a wash of clear water on the paper, then wash on one or more colours. Let dry.
- 6. Use brushes or markers to draw on the paper, reflecting on the words that sparkled for you. The art can be representational, or abstract, perhaps using line, shape, colour and texture to express emotions and concepts.
- 7. Feel free to create at your own level. This is about expressing, not about perfection. Maybe some deep breathing and/ or a short prayer inviting the Holy Spirit to accompany you in this time will get you started.

Wrap up: When 15-20 minutes have passed, and people look like they are finished, the facilitator will go around the circle and ask them to share about their piece. Possible reflection question to get things started:

How has your artistic exploration of the sacred teachings impacted you?

("I have been amazed at the creations and the stories...even "non-artists" have had wonderful paintings and stories – and I have not told them ahead that they will be painting...just led them to the art table after looking at the Seven Sacred Teaching panels on the wall" – Bev McNabb)

Option B

Suggested Time: 45 minutes

- 1. Open your laptop to www.avisualreconciliation.blogspot.com
- 2. Choose three art pieces, (it's good to preselect beforehand). Chose one each from Dazaunggee, Julie, and Xavier, and ask one person to read the description of each piece. The pre-selected pieces may describe an incidence of racism experienced or noticed by the artist. Go around the circle to see what people notice, give comments and have a discussion.
- 3. If there is time, you can look at more art and descriptions, but the painting activity and the three piece discussions usually takes about 45 minutes. (see Option A for instructions on creating a watercolour piece).
- 4. (I usually introduce the exhibit, describing the origin, the artists, the process, after the painting session and before looking at the three pieces. Bev McNabb) The reason I use three pieces instead of four, is that Ted Fullerton, does not have any overt discussion of racism in his works...whereas the other three do. That was not a directive of the project, to discuss racism, or inequalities, but in exploring the Sacred Teachings, these experiences surfaced in the art and the writings.

For either option, perhaps close with a prayer:

Gracious God,

Light the path unto our feet.

Help us to see, and hear and feel the truth of this world.

Help us to find ways to make amends and heal our broken relationships.

May we see the sacred in each other, and offer each other Love.

Amen.

We pray for all who live to the South of us. You give us deep feelings to share with each other. Thank you for women and for all who nurture youth. We pray for families and thank you for Jesus and for his mother Mary. He nurtured others and had a passion for justice and a respect for the gifts of women.

Warm our lives as roots deep in the soil of the earth, and stretch out our hearts as branches to be places of nurture and protection. Sower of life, hear our prayers.

Prayers facing the West (all turn toward the West)

As the sun sets in the West, the darkness comes upon us. we thank you for all we have learned each day. We thank you for elders as they share the wisdom that comes through you. Guide our steps through all ending-times. Fill us with your peace as you enfold us. Fill us with your peace as you enfold us with the great mystery of your grace and love. Creator of kindness, hear our prayers.
