



#### **THE ADDRESS**

"Ordination" by Deacon Dr. Faith Nostbakken

This poem was commissioned for the ordination of Rev. Dr. Larry Kochendorfer as Bishop of the Synod of Alberta and the Territories, January 26, 2013.

#### **THE QUESTIONS**

After asking the Bishop-Elect to affirm his commitment to the office of bishop, the National Bishop asks the assembly:

Will you, the gathered people of God and speaking for the whole church, receive Larry, as national bishop? Will you support Larry's ministry among you, partner with Larry in serving our neighbours and our communities, learn together, pray together, share the meal together, and work to unify the church in God's call to love and reconcile the world?

We will, by the grace of God.

The National Bishop makes the sign of the cross on the bishop-elect's forehead in remembrance of their baptism and sealing in the Holy Spirit:

The God of hope, who has given you the will to do these things, graciously give you the strength and compassion to perform them.

Amen.

#### **CONFESSION OF FAITH**

*The assisting minister introduces the Creed:* 

We confess the faith of the church, the faith in which all our vocations are given expression.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.\* On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

When the Creed is concluded the installing bishop addresses the assembly:


You are baptized servants of God.

#### **HYMN OF INVOCATION**

The National Bishop greets the assembly and invites all present to give thanks:

Let us give thanks to God, who creates, redeems, and sustains.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Gracious God, we give you thanks that you call, gather, enlighten, and sanctify the whole church.

The assembly is invited to extend their hands toward the bishop-elect while the bishops lay hands on the head of the bishop-elect.

# Following a period of silent prayer, the National Bishop continues:

Pour out your Spirit upon <u>Larry</u> to empower and enlighten his ministry as national bishop in your church. Sustain him as a shepherd who tends the flock of Christ with love and gentleness, and oversees the ministries of the church with vision and wisdom. Uphold Larry as a faithful steward of your holy word and life-giving sacraments and a strong sign of reconciliation among all people. Give courage and fortitude to sustain him in this ministry. We ask this through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Savior and Lord, through whom all glory and power and honor are yours in your holy church, both now and forever.

Amen.

The office of national bishop is now committed to you in the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
